Jeannette Zúñiga, was born in Costa Rica, a tropical country in Central America, which is characterized by its nature, peace, and cordiality. She has been happily married for more than forty-seven years and has two daughters, two sons, and four grandchildren.

Jeannette graduated from the University of Costa Rica, where she earned a Bachelor of Arts, a degree in Education, English, Arts and Law. She also has a major in Arts and Teaching Education. Retired from public schools, she has a wide experience in the field of education, enriching her knowledge in this

field for more than twenty-five years serving as a teacher in all levels of education. In 2002 she received, with honors, her Degree in Law at the University of Costa Rica.

Jeannette first taught Spanish lessons to adults at the Language Institute of Costa Rica where she had the opportunity to teach her native language to missionaries who would later work in the Latin American countries. After this important task, she worked as an elementary teacher and a high school teacher in the fields of English and Arts. Jeannette remembers her first job in education as "one of her most joyful, rewarding, and unforgettable life experiences".

As a Delta Kappa Gamma member, she was initiated in Beta Chapter in 1984. She has served as chapter president, state president, executive secretary, and in many other positions of leadership. She has also served as chair on many state committees.
